Introduction

This page presents a summary of results of the annual *Next Step* survey for Eagleby Learning Centre - Centre for Continuing Secondary Education. The *Next Step* survey, undertaken by the Queensland Government, targets all students who completed Year 12 and gained a Senior Statement in 2015, whether they attended a state, Catholic or independent school, or a TAFE secondary college. The Queensland Government Statistician's Office conducted the survey between March and June 2016, approximately six months after the young people left school. Responses were collected online and via computer-assisted telephone interviewing.

Response rate for Eagleby Learning Centre - Centre for Continuing Secondary Education

Table 1 below reports the response rate for Eagleby Learning Centre - Centre for Continuing Secondary Education. It expresses the number of respondents from this school, as a percentage of all Year 12 completers who attended Eagleby Learning Centre - Centre for Continuing Secondary Education in 2015.

Due to the low response rate, these results should be interpreted and used with caution.

Definitions of main destinations

The pathways of Year 12 completers were categorised into ten main destinations. Year 12 completers who were both studying and working were reported as studying for their main destination. A table defining these categories can be found in the statewide report at www.education.qld.gov.au/nextstep.

Summary of findings

In 2016, 36.6% of young people who completed Year 12 at Eagleby Learning Centre - Centre for Continuing Secondary Education in 2015 continued in some recognised form of education and training in the year after they left school.

The most common study destinations were VET Certificate IV+ (9.8%) and VET Certificate I-II (9.8%). The combined VET study destinations accounted for 29.3% of respondents, including 26.8% in campus-based VET programs. A further 7.3% of respondents were studying a Bachelor Degree.

2.4% commenced employment-based training, all as apprentices.

There were no respondents from this school who deferred a tertiary offer in 2016.

63.4% did not enter post-school education or training, and were either employed (36.6%), seeking work (17.1%) or not in the labour force, education or training (9.8%).
