Absence vs Attendance

Does attendance really matter?

1 or 2 days a week doesn't seem like much but ...

If a student misses:

- **1 day per fortnight**, in 10 week term, that equals to 10 weeks per course, which is **75% attendance**
- **1 day per week**, in a 10 week term, that equals 20 weeks per course, which is **50% attendance**

The SERLC handbook states that 100% attendance is required to pass.



Mobile Phone Policy



Mobile phones are NOT to be used in the classroom - please refer to the "Student Handbook":

All mobile phones must be turned off or on silent during classes and not be used without teacher approval.

There should be NO personal reason for a mobile phone to be on during class. If there is an emergency, parents should ring the relevant campus office and the student will be contacted via office staff.

If students carry mobile phones on their possession, it is their responsibility to keep them safe and secure. The College waives all responsibility for the usage, damage or theft of any mobile phones on College grounds.

Friendly reminder that the school day concludes at 4.15 pm. Please ensure prompt pick up at the end of the school day to ensure that students are not left to wait, especially in inclement weather. Your cooperation with this is greatly appreciated.
