A note from the Dean of Students

Term 2 is underway, and with our condensed curriculum, students are already busy completing assessments. Therefore, I thought it would be a timely reminder to emphasize the importance of attendance. Each of our classes covers a week's worth of mainstream school work in every lesson, making it crucial for students to be positive, present, and productive in every class. Eagleby Learning Centre has a 'No Pass, No Progress' policy, underscoring the significance of being in class for advancing to the next unit of work. Additionally, if a student is unable to complete an assessment task on the due date, a medical certificate is vital, or contact with the school must be made that day, as per QCAA requirements.

A message from the Head of Department

Between now and the end of term (depending on your student's classes and year level), our assessment period will be in full swing! If your senior student is absent during the assessment period, a medical certificate is required in order to request an AARA (Access Arrangements and Reasonable Adjustments) extension. The medical certificate must include the date of all relevant absences. We understand that it is sometimes difficult to get into a doctor, however some pharmacies now provide medical certificates as well as online services that email you a certificate directly.

Unfortunately, personal holidays are not eligible for an extension and as such, your student will still need to adhere to the assessment deadlines.

Absence vs Attendance

Does attendance really matter?

1 or 2 days a week doesn't seem like much but.......

If a student misses:

- 1 day per fortnight, in 10 week term, that equals to 10 weeks per course, which is 75% attendance.
- **1 day per week,** in a 10 week term, that equals 20 weeks per course, which is **50% attendance**.

The SERLC handbook states that 100% attendance is required to pass.





Mobile Phone Policy
