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Awesome news here.....

This week in Science in Practice we have been investigating DNA and Genetics. As part of this we have extracted the DNA from strawberries. The process involved breaking open the cells and separating the DNA. First, the strawberries were mashed to break open cell walls. Then, a lysis solution containing detergent and salt was added to dissolve cell membranes and release DNA into the solution. The detergent breaks down lipid membranes, while the salt helps DNA strands clump together. Finally, cold alcohol (such as isopropanol) was carefully layered over the mixture, causing the DNA to precipitate out of the solution, making it visible as white, stringy strands. The students were then able to remove this from the mixture.
