## Consent to share personal information with QCAA only, for the purpose of AARA

### Access arrangements and reasonable adjustments (AARA)

The QCAA (Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority) recognises that some students may have disability, impairment and/or medical conditions or experience other circumstances that may affect their ability to read, respond to and participate in assessment. Access arrangements and reasonable adjustments (AARA) are designed to assist these students.

If you think you/your child may need an access arrangement or reasonable adjustment/s, the following consent form should be signed to allow the Guidance officer to share personal information about the student with the QCAA.

### Consent to share personal information with QCAA

Consent is required for the Guidance Officer to request, receive and share personal information.
